### **INDIA SET TO DEFEND ILLINOIS OPEN TITLE**

**FLOSSMOOR, Ill. – AUGUST 2, 2024** – Winning multiple Illinois Open Championships is a rarity. Prior to 2023, only 14 individuals had achieved this feat. However, Chicago’s own Vince India became just the 15th player to win multiple Illinois Open Championships with his victory at the 74th Illinois Open Championship at Flossmoor Golf Club in 2024. Already in a group of Illinois golf legends, can India cement himself in Illinois Golf history by becoming the third three-time winner at the 75th Illinois Open Championship?

54 holes wasn’t enough to settle the 74th Illinois Open Championship. India made birdie on his 54th hole of the tournament to force a playoff against Dylan Meyer (Evansville, Ind.). A three-hole aggregate playoff ensued, the first of its kind since 2012. India played the three playoff holes (holes 16, 17, and 18) in 1-under-par, making a birdie on the final playoff hole to secure his second Illinois Open Championship.

“It feels great to be a two-time champion,” said India. “There’s a lot of accomplished players on that list of multiple winners and I’m just happy to be among them.”

India put together a fine tournament at the 74th Illinois Open Championship with rounds of 70, 68, and 70 to card a three-day total of 8-under-par 208. He trailed the leaders by three strokes after round one, but was in a three-way tie for the lead after 36 holes. Impressive play down the stretch proved to be crucial for India who birdied three of his final six holes to force the playoff.

Since his victory, India has not been seen much in the competitive golf circuit. A suspension from the Korn Ferry Tour forced India to miss the final six months of the 2023 season. India has been working tirelessly on his game since his victory at the 74th Illinois Open trying to get his game back to his 2020 form.

“The (Illinois) Open will let me try out some changes that I’ve been working on this year and see how they handle under a bit of pressure,” said India. “I haven’t played a whole lot this summer. I’ve been trying to fix my swing and restore it to where it was in 2020 so it will be nice to see how it feels in competition.”

2020 of course was India’s best year on the Korn Ferry Tour, which featured 11 top 25 finishes and six top 10 finishes. He ended the year 43rd on the Korn Ferry Tour Regular Season points list.

Looking to get things back on track, the Illinois Open could be just what India needs. Following his first victory in 2018, India went on to play in nine Korn Ferry Tour events in 2018 before finishing the 2019 season at No. 85 on the Korn Ferry Tour Regular Season points list, recording three tops 25s, including a season-best solo-fifth at the WinCo Foods Portland Open presented by KraftHeinz. He remained steady on the Korn Ferry Tour, playing in 85 events from 2020 to 2023.

## ***India Set to Defend Illinois Open Title.p.2***

“I think the Illinois Open has served as a confidence builder over the years for me, even back to the days when I was an amateur in high school,” said India. “It’s a privilege to tee it up against the best in your state, it doesn’t happen very often. Recently the (Illinois) Open has provided some great moments of golf in the otherwise dark years of my career.”

Defending his title at the Illinois Open would put India in the exclusive back-to-back champion group that includes some of the best golfers the state of Illinois has ever produced. The gentlemen that make up this group highlight the Illinois Open record books. Bob Harris (1955, 1956), Gary Pinns (1985, 1986), Marty Schiene (1991, 1992), and Mike Small (2005, 2006, 2007) are the four players who have won back-to-back Illinois Open titles in the post-1950 modern era of the event.

India will get his chance to join this group next week at a familiar site in Flossmoor Golf Club.

## **CHAMPIONSHIP GOLF RETURNS TO FLOSSMOOR GOLF CLUB FOR ILLINOIS OPEN'S 75TH ANNIVERSARY**

**FLOSSMOOR, Ill – August 2, 2024** – There have been many significant events held at Flossmoor Golf Club (originally named Homewood Country Club) that have included many of the game's greats. Starting back in the early 1900s, Flossmoor Golf Club was continuously used to host some of the most historic golf events. The Illinois Open is no stranger to Flossmoor Golf nor is it excluded from the list of prestigious events that have called Flossmoor its home in the past. On Monday, August 5, 2024, the Illinois Open will return to the Homewood area as Flossmoor Golf Club plays host to the 75th playing of the Illinois Open.

The first Illinois Open took place in 1950, but it only took five years for the Illinois State Championship of Golf to call on Flossmoor Golf Club. In 1955 Bob Harris won the fifth iteration of the Illinois Open, and although much has changed with Flossmoor Golf Club since 1955, it has still stood the test of time as a Championship golf course.

After 1995, it wasn't until 1984 that Flossmoor Golf Club was back on the schedule for the Illinois Open Championship. Lance Ten Broeck was the Champion that year and Nick Zambole broke Bobby Jones' course record after a first-round 66.

Flossmoor was most recently called upon just one year ago to host the Illinois Open for the first time in 39 years. A proper test of golf was presented as eventual Champion, Vince India, defeated Dylan Meyer in the event's first playoff since 2012. India also joined an exclusive club as the event's 15th multi-winner (2018, 2023).

The 75th Illinois Open Championship will certainly look different than the first two Illinois Opens that were held at Flossmoor Golf Club. The course has since undergone two renovations that improved the green complexes, the bunkering, and added more yardage. In 1955, the course played a total of 6,700 yards. In 2024, it will play close to 7,200 yards. The tournament itself has changed as well. Starting in 2015, the Illinois Open went to a two-site Championship. That format lasted until 2020 when the Illinois Open moved back to a one-site Championship. In 1955, the winner at Flossmoor Golf Club took home \$500, in 1984 it was \$5,000. The 2024 Illinois Open purse has not been announced but in both of the previous two Championships, the winner has taken home over \$20,000. A look back at Flossmoor Golf Club and its rich history of Championship Golf shows just what kind of Championship we are in for in 2024.

## ***Championship Golf Returns to Flossmoor Golf Club/p.2***

On September 1, 1900, the New York Times reported that a 6,100 yard golf course designed by Herbert Tweedie by the name of Homewood Country Club was opening. In 1906 Flossmoor Golf Club hosted its first major golf event. It was the Western Open. During this time, the Western Open was considered equal to that of the U.S. Open. Alex Smith and Willie Anderson highlighted the field of the 1906 Western Open, both would win multiple Western and U.S. Opens in their careers. In the end, it was Smith who came out victorious, snatching one of his two Western Open Championships and winning the first major event played at Flossmoor Golf Club.

A few years later, the Western Golf Association was knocking on the door of Flossmoor Golf Club again for the 1909 Western Amateur. It would be the first of many appearances at Flossmoor for the great Chick Evans, who won his first of eight Western Amateur Championships at Flossmoor Golf in 1909.

In 1911, Harry Collis who was the Club's President at the time was asked to take over the course's greenkeeping with the responsibility of bringing out the course's full potential. Collis eventually became known as an accomplished agronomist who created Flossmoor Bent Grass, still a popular type of grass for putting greens. Collis' impact on Flossmoor is most evident in the remarkable green complexes. For his contributions, Collis was inducted into the Illinois Golf Hall of Fame in 2023.

The name-brand events took a short break from Flossmoor during the Great War, but that didn't stop them from attracting notable events. In 1917 and 1918 Red Cross Matches were played across the country in an effort to raise money for the Red Cross. Flossmoor Golf Club hosted one match each year. In 1917, the match at Flossmoor Golf featured the likes of Robert Garner and Chick Evans vs. Perry Adair and Bobby Jones.

Then in 1920, the third annual PGA Championship was held at Flossmoor Golf Club. It was a PGA Member from Illinois who took home the Wanamaker trophy that year. Jock Hutchison, the Head PGA Professional at the Glen View Club at the time, had gotten into the PGA Championship as an alternate when two other players in the field withdrew from the event. The 1920 PGA Championship sparked yet another prestigious event to come to Flossmoor Golf Club just three years later.

The U.S. Amateur was the next big golf event to make its way to Homewood, and the field in 1923 did not disappoint. Max Martson was the ultimate winner defeating the likes of Bobby Jones, Francis Ouimet, and Jess Sweester. Chick Evans was also in the field that year.

The 75th Illinois Open will pull a lot of Flossmoor's history into play, ranging from the original routing from Tweedie in the early 1900s to Collis' green complexes to the Thomas-style golden age bunker designs that were put in place by Raymond Hearn in 2006. But this year's Illinois Open will also make its own mark on the history of Flossmoor Golf Club. Nine (9) of the top 10 finishers from the 2023 Illinois Open Championship will be competing, including the likes of defending Champion Vince India. In fact, five of the last six Illinois Open Champions will be featured in this event. The strength of the field continues when you throw in the likes of three current PGA Tour/Korn Ferry Tour players, three PGA Professionals who appeared in the 2024 PGA Championship, and both of the previous Illinois State Amateur winners, who both won back-to-back titles from 2019-2023.

Each of them will have the chance to put their name next to the likes of Bobby Jones and Chick Evans, but they will have to pass the test that is Flossmoor Golf Club first.

### **ANTHONY ALBANO, JR., 31**

**Park Ridge, Ill./ Illinois Wesleyan (Class of 2015)**

- Making his fourth consecutive Illinois Open Championship appearance.
- Three top 10 finishes at the last three Illinois Opens.
- Three top 10 finishes in six appearances on the Dakotas Tour in 2024.
- Currently 5th on the Dakotas Tour Money List.
- Finished 8th at the 74th Illinois Open Championship in 2023.

### **MATTHIS BESARD, 24**

**Oudenaarde, Belgium /University of Iowa (Class of 2023)**

- Making his first career Illinois Open appearance.
- Has played in 17 DP World Tour Events in 2024.
- Currently ranks 127th on the DP World Tour.
- Finished T6 at the DP World Tour's 2024 BMW International Open.

### **QUINN CLIFFORD (a), 21**

**Chicago, Ill./ Illinois Wesleyan (Class of 2025)**

- Won the 2023 Illinois Open Low Amateur after finishing T3.
- Finished in top-20 in eight of 10 events at Illinois Wesleyan in 2023.
- Set the Illinois Wesleyan program record with an 8-under-par 63 at the Carthage Fall Classic.
- Earned 2023 All-Conference Honors.
- Tied for 72nd at the 2023 NCAA Championship.

**KYLE DONOVAN, 29**

**Chicago, Ill./PGA Professional at Oak Park Country Club**

- Has appeared in six Illinois PGA Bernardi Player of the Year events, recording four top-10 finishes.
- Currently fifth on the Illinois PGA Bernardi Player of the Year Player of the Year list.
- Has made the cut at five of the last six Illinois Opens.
- Finished T13 at the 74th Illinois Open Championship in 2023 (career-best finish) and tied with Mike Small as the Low Illinois PGA Professional.

**MICHAEL FEAGLES, 26**

**Phoenix, Ariz./University of Illinois (Class of 2020)**

- Making first career Illinois Open appearance.
- Has played in 46 career Korn Ferry Tour events recording, one top-five finish, and one top-10 finish.

**Mahomet, Ill./ Southern Illinois University (Class of 2019)**

- Making his fourth consecutive Illinois Open Championship appearance.
- Has finished in the top 10 in the last three Illinois Open Championships.
- Best finish at the Illinois Open came in 2021 when he finished second.
- Finished T3 at the 74th Illinois Open Championship in 2023.

**LUKE GUTHRIE, 34**

**Quincy, Ill./University of Illinois (Class of 2012)**

- Making his first Illinois Open appearance since 2010.
- Best career finish came in 2010 when he finished second and won the Illinois Open Low Amateur Award.
- Has played in 106 career PGA TOUR events.
- Has played in 128 career Korn Ferry Tour events, recording two victories and 13 top-10 finishes.
- His 54-hole score of 202 in 2010 still stands as the fifth-lowest 54-hole score ever at an Illinois Open, and is the second-lowest 54-hole score ever recorded by an amateur.

**VINCE INDIA, 35**

**Deerfield, Ill./University of Iowa (Class of 2011)**

- Won the 75th Illinois Open Championship at Flossmoor Golf in 2023.
- Is just the 15th multi-winner of the Illinois Open Championship.
- Recorded 11 top-25s, including six top-10s, in 42 Korn Ferry Tour starts across the 2020-21.
- One (1) of only nine (9) players to win the Illinois Amateur Championship (2010) and the Illinois Open Championship (2018, 2023).
- One (1) of nine (9) Illinois Open past Champions in the 75th Illinois Open Championship field.

**JEFF KELLEN, 35**

**Glenview, Ill./PGA Professional at North Shore Country Club**

- Finished T8 at the 2024 PGA Professional Championship and qualified for the 2024 PGA Championship at Valhalla Golf Club.
- Best finish at the Illinois Open came in 2018 when he finished fifth.
- Finished T2 at the 2023 Nadler Golf Cars Illinois PGA Professional Championship at Thunderhawk Golf Club.
- Currently seventh in the 2024 Illinois PGA Bernardi Player of the Year points race.

**TEE-K KELLY, 30**

**Wheaton, Ill./Ohio State University (Class of 2016)**

- Won the 72nd Illinois Open Championship at Stonebridge Country Club.
- Five top 15 finishes in his last six Illinois Open appearances including four top 10s.
- Only player ever to win two Illinois Amateur Championships (2013, 2015) and the Illinois Open Championship (2021).
- One (1) of nine (9) Illinois Open past Champions in the 75th Illinois Open Championship field.
- Finished T24 at the 74th Illinois Open Championship in 2023.

**BRAD MAREK, 40**

**Berkeley, Calif./PGA Professional at Corica Park**

- Making his first Illinois Open appearance since 2017 where he finished T11 (best career finish).
- Has appeared in 11 Illinois Open Championships, having never finished outside the top 30 including five top 20 finishes.
- Finished T-6 in the 2024 PGA Professional Championship to earn a spot in the 2024 PGA Championship at Valhalla Golf Club.
- Finished T-8 at the 2021 PGA Professional Championship to earn a spot in the 2021 PGA Championship at The Ocean Course at Kiawah Island.
- One of two PGA Professionals to make the cut at the 2021 PGA Championship, finishing in 78th place.

**MAC MCCLEAR, 23**

**Hinsdale, Ill./University of Iowa (Class of 2024)**

- Making his first Illinois Open appearance since 2021.
- Finished in the top 10 at both of his Illinois Open appearances (2020, 2021).
- Won the 2021 Illinois Open Championship Low Amateur Award, recording his best career finish at T5.
- Won the 2021 and 2022 Illinois Amateur Championship becoming just the 11th player to register back-to-back wins in the 92-year history of the event.
- Finished T26 at the 2024 Waterloo Open Golf Classic.

**DYLAN MEYER, 29**

**Evansville, Ind./University of Illinois (Class of 2018)**

- Making his second consecutive Illinois Open appearance.
- Finished second at the 75th Illinois Open, losing in a playoff to Vince India.
- Has three top 20 finishes in six Minor League Golf League events in 2024.
- Finished T20 at the 2018 U.S. Open at Shinnecock Hills Golf Club.

**CHARLIE NIKITAS, 25**

**Glenview, Ill./University of Alabama (Class of 2022)**

- Two top-10 finishes in the last three Illinois Open Championships.
- Best finish at the Illinois Open is T9 (2023 and 2021).
- Finished T43 at the 2024 PGA TOUR Americas' Explore NB Open.

**DAVID PERKINS, 26**

**East Peoria, Ill./Illinois State University (Class of 2021)**

- Won the 73<sup>rd</sup> Illinois Open Championship at White Eagle Golf Club in 2022.
- Has appeared in 16 Minor League Golf events in 2024, finishing inside the top five eight times, including back-to-back victories in February.
- One (1) of nine (9) Illinois Open past Champions in the 75th Illinois Open Championship field.
- One (1) of only eight (8) players to win the CDGA Championship (2018) and the Illinois Open Championship (2022).
- Finished T3 at the 74th Illinois Open Championship in 2023.

**MIKE SMALL, 56**

**Champaign, Ill./PGA Professional, University of Illinois Men's Golf Team Head Coach**

- Has appeared in 15 of the last 16 Illinois Open Championships.
- Ranks second for the most Illinois Open Championship wins with four, including three straight wins from 2005-2007.
- Has the second most Illinois Open runners-up finishes with three (1993, 2008, 2009).
- Won the 2024 Nadler Golf Cars Illinois Senior PGA Professional Championship at The Grove Country Club for the seventh time in his career.
- Finished T13 at the 74th Illinois Open Championship in 2023, tying Kyle Donovan as the Low Illinois PGA Professional.
- One (1) of nine (9) Illinois Open past Champions in the 75th Illinois Open Championship field.

**ANDY SVOBODA, 44**

**Oak Brook, Ill./PGA Professional at Butler National Golf Club**

- Finished T-2 at the 2024 PGA Professional Championship to earn a berth in the 2024 PGA Championship at Valhalla Golf Club.
- Won the 2023 Connecticut PGA Professional Championship, Connecticut PGA Match Play Championship, and Connecticut PGA Player of the Year.
- Has qualified for six U.S. Open Championships including the 2024 U.S. Open at Pinehurst No.2.
- Has three career Korn Ferry Tour victories.
- Finished second at the 2024 Illinois PGA Match Play Championship.
- Currently leads the 2024 Illinois PGA Bernardi Player of the Year points race.

## **THE ILLINOIS OPEN – A SHORT HISTORY**

Those who tee off in the 75th Illinois Open owe a debt of thanks to two men who willed the championship to life a few years after the end of World War II.

There had been an Illinois Open in the past, conducted sporadically and dating to at least 1923, when the Illinois PGA conducted a tournament by that name at the Country Club of Peoria, in which Joe Kirkwood beat Jock Hutchison by four strokes, ending the 72-hole affair with a flourish by holing out at the last from a greenside bunker for an eagle 2. (The Illinois PGA's Section Championship was conducted concurrently, and Hutchison grabbed the trophy for that.)

Leo Diegel, brothers Abe and Al Espinosa and Harry Cooper, the latter on at least three occasions, also captured an Illinois Open title, but by the late 1930s, there was no such competition.

Neither professional Harry Pezzullo nor amateur administrator Chuck Eckstein was satisfied with the hole in the annual schedule, and they set about filling it in.

Pezzullo, president of the Illinois PGA, and Eckstein, flying the colors of the Chicago District Golf Association, worked out an agreement for the rebirth of the Illinois Open. The two organizations would combine to administrate the championship, from selecting courses to raising the purse to making rulings.

The result was a championship that earned instant respect, and received a quality-filled list of champions, from the start. Felice Torza, nicknamed the "Toy Tiger" for his charge to the semifinals of the 1947 U.S. Amateur, won the first renewal, held at Onwentsia Club in 1950. A parade of notables followed, including Bill Ogden in 1952 – the first of a pair of titles – Errie Ball the following year, and Bob Harris, the first to claim back-to-back crowns, in 1955-56, during a brief name-change to Illinois Invitational Open. (Qualifying wasn't instituted until 1972.)

Ogden, Harris and Torza, who won again in 1958, were threats through the decade, the start of a pattern. Rare was the one-shot challenger unless he moved out of state. Jack Bell, Dick Hart (the first three-time winner) and Emil Esposito popped up time and again.

A generation later, Gary Hallberg – the first amateur to triumph, in 1977 – and Gary Pinns followed as repeat winners. Pinns, a teammate of Hallberg's at Wake Forest, won as an amateur in 1978, then four more times as a professional, the last time in 1990, becoming a three-decade champ. He's the only five-time winner.

Only Mike Small has won three straight, dominating from 2005-07 to go with a title in 2003.

The Illinois Open has been played in extreme heat – a heat index of 105 one year at Fox Bend prompted approval for players to wear shorts – and bitter cold, as anyone who survived the 34-degree first round at Briarwood in May of 1966 will tell you.

In 1971, the Illinois PGA took full control of the championship, adding qualifying the following year and beginning a long rise in the purse. It was \$13,000 by 1980, \$60,000 by 1993, and hit \$100,000 for the first time in 1998, when 637 players were either exempt or tried to qualify.

Amateurs have won 11 of the 74 titles, and have been runner-up, either solo or sharing, on 10 other occasions. Hallberg and Pinns won first as amateurs and then as pros, but only Rick Ten Broeck went in the other direction. He was an assistant at Naperville Country Club when he cashed a \$1,500 check for beating Don Stickney in a playoff at Barrington Hills in 1973, and a reinstated amateur when he won at Bon Vivant in Bourbonnais in 1981. Runner-up Bob Augustine accepted the \$6,000 first money as balm.

The lowest rounds are 62s shot by David Lawrence and amateur Matt Weber at Royal Melbourne in 2015, and Daniel Hudson at Stonebridge in 2021, but perhaps the most intriguing performance came from Penn State student Scott Tharrington at Elgin in 1983. He scored an albatross and an eagle in the first round, and managed only a par 72.

Sometimes, golf cannot be explained.

A purse of \$120,000 was shared among players who competed in the 74th Illinois Open Championship. Amateur contestants will receive gift certificates up to \$1,000 each. The winner has his/her name permanently engraved on the Illinois Open trophy.

**Format:** The 75th Illinois Open Championship is a 54-hole stroke play event with a 156 player field size limit. The field is comprised of place-winners in the qualifying events and those players exempted from qualifying. Players will complete all three rounds at Flossmoor Golf Club. Following 36 holes of play, the field will be cut to the low 50 scorers plus ties. In the case of a tie for the Championship, a three (3) hole aggregate playoff will take place following the posting of the final score. If the tie has not been broken after three holes, the playoff will continue at sudden death.

**Eligibility:** Both exempt and individuals attempting to qualify must meet one of the following eligibility categories

1. Legal Resident of Illinois.
2. Illinois Section - PGA Member or Associate.
3. Non-PGA Golf Professional working as such on a full-time basis within the state of Illinois.
4. Graduate of a high school or postsecondary school within the boundaries of the state of Illinois.
5. Presently enrolled at a postsecondary school (college or the like) within the boundaries of the state of Illinois. Including incoming freshmen.

*All amateurs must carry a verified handicap of 10.0 or less*

*For categories 1-3, the requirements must be applicable at the time of registration and participation in any/all qualifiers/championships.*

## **THE 74TH ILLINOIS OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP**

Flossmoor Golf Club Hole-by-Hole Descriptions

**Hole 1 (Par 5)** – Flossmoor Golf Club opens with a welcoming 500-yard dogleg right par-5. With out-of-bounds to the left of the fairway, players want to position their drives between the three large fairway bunkers that surround the landing area approximately 300 yards off the tee. A well-positioned drive invites players to go for the green in under regulation with a mid to long iron. The green tilts from left to right on approach and is surrounded by 3 large bunkers.

**Hole 2 (Par 3)** – Turning back towards the south, the par-3 second hole can play anywhere from 175 yards to 200 yards depending on where the tee is set. The tee shot requires a precise long iron into this slightly elevated green that tilts from back to front. The front of the green is guarded by two large bunkers that will test the players' accuracy off the tee if the pin is positioned in the front of the green.

**Hole 3 (Par 4)** – The third hole at Flossmoor Golf Club ranks as the number one handicap hole on the course. Players are left with several options off of the tee on this tricky par-4. With out-of-bounds left and a small creek that runs through the middle of the fairway, players are forced to either lay up short with a 245-yard shot or attempt to carry the creek with a drive over 300 yards. The approach shot can vary anywhere from 190 yards to 130 yards depending on the decision made off the tee. The third green slopes severely from back to front and can penalize players who hit their approach shot long. Much like the first two holes, the front of the third green is guarded by two greenside bunkers.

**Hole 4 (Par 4)** – The 330-yard par-4 fourth hole provides players with a rare scoring opportunity at Flossmoor Golf Club. Longer hitters can choose to attack the green off the tee if the wind is in their favor. The reward, however, comes with its risks, as this green is surrounded by greenside bunkers. With out-of-bounds running down the entire left side of the hole and bunkers scattered throughout the landing area, players can opt to lay back off the tee and hit a long iron anywhere within the range of 180 to 220 yards. A shot within that range leaves the player with around 120 yards into this back-to-front sloping green.

**Hole 5 (Par 4)** – The par- 4 fifth hole tips out at 445 yards. Much like the last two holes, the fifth brings out of bounds into play down the entire left-hand side. A well-placed drive puts the player firmly between the two fairway bunkers that guard the landing area approximately 300 yards off the tee. From there, players are greeted with a 140-yard shot to the center of this semi-flat green. Once again, the front of the green is guarded by two large greenside bunkers.

**Hole 6 (Par 4)** – Off of the tee on the 434-yard par-4 sixth, players are forced to play a left-to-right shot in order to avoid the out-of-bounds down the left-hand side and the grove of trees to the right. A single fairway bunker sits approximately 240 yards off of the tee and punishes players who happen to find it. A 300-yard drive leaves players with around 135 yards into a green that slopes gently from back to front. Accuracy is required on approach as the sixth green is surrounded by four large greenside bunkers.

**Hole 7 (Par-3)** – The second of the four par-3s on the course, the seventh will play around 170 yards for the Illinois Open. The large pond comes into play just nine yards in front of the green. The seventh green tilts from back to front and features a false front approach which further brings the pond into play.

In addition to being played from the main tee box on the south side of the property, the seventh hole will be played from another tee box on the eastern side of the property. Typically reserved for the shorter players, the 7th hole will play between 105-115 yards depending on the hole location. It is only 83 yards to cover the water from this angle, however, a greenside bunker is looming for short shots. Taking the angle into account will be pivotal for predicting ground spin, as all shots will run from right to left once on the green.

**Hole 8 (Par-4)** – Accuracy off the tee is once again rewarded on the par-4 eighth. With three large fairway bunkers that come into play around 240 yards off the tee, players are forced to hit a left-to-right tee shot to have an angle into this long par-4 dogleg right. The approach is no walk in the park either, as a large pond guards the entire front side of this back-to-front sloping green. A well-placed tee shot leaves players with around 200 yards into the eighth green.

**Hole 9 (Par 5)** – Wrapping up the front-9, the 620-yard par-5 ninth is a true three-shot hole for most players. A fairway bunker guards the right-hand side of the landing area approximately 300 yards off the tee. From there, players are left with around 320 yards in for their approach shots, forcing many to lay up. With out-of-bounds to the left and the driving range to the right, the target lay-up area sits just 30 yards wide. Once players reach the green, they are greeted with a semi-flat putting surface that rewards accurate approach shots.

**Hole 10 (Par 5)** – The par-5 10th hole provides players with a breath of fresh air to start their new nine. Playing just 553 yards for the Illinois Open, longer hitters can find this green easily under regulation with just a mid to long iron in. A drive of around 300 yards puts players firmly between the two fairway bunkers that sit approximately 290 and 320 yards off the tee. From there, players are left with a semi-blind second shot into this severe back-to-front sloping green. With out-of-bounds down the entire left side, missing shots to the right is a player's best bet.

**Hole 11 (Par 3)** – Turning back up the hill, players are greeted with a 187-yard uphill par-3. With a large false front and a green surrounded by five large bunkers, precision is needed if players want to attack the pin on this green. The 11th green tilts gently from left to right.

**Hole 12 (Par 4)** – Players are once again greeted with a blind tee shot on the 417-yard par-4 12th hole. The creek in front of the fairway does not come into play on this hole, but players should be wary about the out-of-bounds down the entire left side. A drive of 300 yards leaves players with around 95 yards in on their approach shot. The 12th green slopes gently from front to back, making wedge precision a priority on approach.

**Hole 13 (Par 3)** – Tucked away on the far south side of the property, the 135-yard par-3 13th tests the players' short iron accuracy. With a large greenside bunker guarding the front right portion of this green, players are forced to carry all 135 yards to find the middle of this right-to-left sloping green.

**Hole 14 (Par 4)** – Scoring can be found in abundance on the short, 337-yard par-4 14th. A drive that splits the tree in the middle of the fairway and the collection of trees on the right gives players the best look into this short par-4. Don't let the short length deceive you, though, as the 14th green is ranked one of the hardest on the course. With four large greenside bunkers surrounding the perimeter of the green, precision is needed on approach. The green slopes from back to front with an average of four degrees of slope the entire way down.

**Hole 15 (Par 4)** – Course knowledge is key when taking on the 430-yard par-4 15th. A slight dogleg to the left forces player tee shots to turn from right to left to find themselves comfortably in the 30-yard-wide landing zone at the bottom of the hill. The creek, which sits around 340 yards off the tee, will not come into play for most players. From the landing zone, players are left with around 125 yards into this back-to-front sloping green guarded by two greenside bunkers.

**Hole 16 (Par 4)** – Distance is once again a player's friend on the par-4 16th, which will measure anywhere from 425-450 yards during the Illinois Open. With a large fairway bunker sitting around 300 yards down the fairway, players are forced to flirt with the long lefthand rough off the tee. For their approach shots, players are left with around 150 yards into a highly elevated green protected by a large greenside bunker. The 16<sup>th</sup> green slopes from back to front, further bringing the front greenside bunker into play.

**Hole 17 (Par 4)** – For most players, the 473-yard, par-4 17th will play as a true two-shot hole. A creek sits firmly in the middle of the landing zones around 310 yards off the tee. With the usual southern wind that blows at Flossmoor Golf Club in the afternoon, players can attempt to carry the creek, leaving them with just around 110 yards in. Most players, however, will lay short of the water, leaving them with a 175-yard shot into this highly elevated, back-to-front sloping green guarded by a large oak tree on the right.

**Hole 18 (Par 5)** – The par-5 18th hole at Flossmoor Golf Club plays 530 yards for the Illinois Open. With out-of-bounds down the entire left side, the players' tee shots must favor the right-hand side of the fairway, which brings the two large fairway bunkers into play. Should players manage to avoid all those obstacles, they are left with a second shot of around 225 yards in. Bunkers litter the landing area for the players' second shots, so accuracy is needed if players choose to lay back. The eighteenth green tilts severely from right to left and is guarded by 3 greenside bunkers.
